

WHAT ARE THE FALSE CLAIMS ACTS?

- The Federal and State False Claims Acts were enacted to combat fraud, waste and abuse committed by contractors against the government
 - Federal False Claims Act (31 USC 3729-3730)
 - California False Claims Act (CA Govt Code 12650-12653)
- We often refer to both sets of rules, together, as 'FCA'
- Contractors' FCA requirements are typically found in the County contract template, section 8.18



WHAT ARE CONTRACTORS' REQUIREMENTS?

- Contractors must ensure all of their workforce members are trained on FCA, at least annually
 - Workforce members' include all positions paid by the contract, including those paid with indirect funds. 'Workforce members' also include those with access to County clients or County client data, even if the positions are unpaid
- Contractors must maintain verification of the training
- Contractors must pass down FCA requirements to their subcontractors, consultants, and other agents
